### **Waste Audits**

 Timing and frequency of data collection depends largely on financial and resource availability

 The specific aim and purpose of the audit will determine the methods used to collect data

### Remote site work and COVID 19

- Challenged to innovate

 COVID-19 restricted travel meaning the audit supervisor could not travel to the audit location.

Client needed to proceed with the work.

#### **AUDIT TEAM**

Data and photos captured. Uploaded to GIS system

### CO-ORDINATOR and AUDIT TEAM

Feedback communicated to audit team

#### T+T


QA of photos and data (checking ID tags match, % error of weight totals, correct assigning of waste into categories)

#### **T+T and CO-ORDINATOR**

Feedback is supplied to coordinator daily - results and targets

# Challenges

 Risks in delay of receiving information > Clear timeframes, early communication

Building team relationships

Utilizing digital capability

Trouble shooting can be more difficult

Creativity especially use of videos

Oversight of quality

> Photos, videos, real time data uploads

## Key takeaways

 Little development in the way we conduct audits – an area to explore.

 Potential applications for audits where mobilisation of an onsite team is restricted or too costly.

 Audit resources go further, data collected more thorough, work towards addressing concerns of only collecting "snapshots".

 Need to always come back to is the audit design meeting the desired outcomes.
